The Importance of Collections in Museums

Collection objects are at the center of the Brownsville Historical Association's mission to preserve, educate, and promote the history, heritage, and cultural arts of Brownsville, Texas and its environs. Museums exist to preserve, record, and research the materials donated to the collection and held in public trust. Also, museums provide accessibility of their collection to the public though exhibitions, programs, and interpretations. For the BHA, each object yields new discoveries and provides a unique narrative.

In the twenty-first century, the definition of collections in the museum field includes: artifacts, works of art, specimens, and archival documents. In most recent years, institutions have modified the definition to include intangible materials including video and audio recordings. Museum collections are more than an accumulation of objects; they are meticulously chosen assemblages, the product defined by curatorial expertise.

The fundamental act of museum collecting removes objects from their original habitat and context, to incorporate them into part of a larger acquisition. As a result, the BHA (like other museum institutions) are tasked with the work of exhibit modification and reinterpretation to permanent displays every so often. We hope that as part of your membership, you take advantage of visiting our museums year-round to view our temporary exhibits as well as changes made to our permanent exhibits. Thanks to donations over the years, we are able to tell the rich history of Brownsville, Matamoros and the Rio Grande Valley through our diverse collections of objects.
