

Remembering Carl Chilton




Carl S. Chilton, Jr. *May* 23, 1923 - Oct. 22, 2023

he Brownsville Historical Association was saddened to hear news about the passing of Carl S. Chilton, Jr. in late October of this year. Carl Chilton was a businessman, community leader, local historian, author, and supporter of the BHA.

Chilton was born May 23, 1923, in Roswell, New Mexico. His family moved to the Rio Grande Valley the following year. They lived in Harlingen and eventually Port Isabel. Later, he went

onto attend Texas A&I College in Kingsville (present day Texas A&M University–Kingsville) before his studies were placed on hold by World War II after two years in Kingsville. Chilton served in the U.S. Army Air Corps flying B-26 twin-engine bombers. The 9th Air Force Division was stationed in France flying missions over Germany from 1944 to 1945. Chilton would later publish *Memories of a Military Pilot: 1942-1945*, based on letters he wrote to his parents during his years in the military.

In late 1945, Chilton was discharged from the military and resumed his college education at The University of Texas at Austin and graduated in 1947 with a degree in accounting. He returned to Brownsville a year later and began teaching in a program for returning veterans at Brownsville Junior College (present day Texas Southmost College). Then in 1950, he passed the Certified Public Accountant (CPA) examination and started working with Bill Long, another CPA, eventually forming Long Chilton, LLP accounting firm in 1951. The firm grew to have offices in Brownsville, Harlingen, and McAllen. After 37 years, Chilton retired from Long Chilton in 1988.

After his retirement, Chilton dedicated more time to his writing. He authored some successful books on accounting practices as well as magazine articles on similar subjects and weekly local history articles for *The Brownsville Herald*. His first project in retirement was tracing his family tree back to 1775 and generating a family history that involved extensive research in Missouri. Following this personal project, Chilton went on to author several Brownsville history books on a variety of subjects. These included *A History of*
